PRESENTATION OF APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$10,000 FROM SENATOR BILL HOLTZCLAW FOR PALMER PARK UPPER QUAD SCOREBOARDS

Senator Holtzclaw presented a check in the amount of \$10,000 to be used towards the Palmer Park upper quad scoreboards. A round of applause was given.

PRESENTATION TO COUNCIL BY TAMI TUBELL, PROGRAM MANAGER FOR HUNTSVILLE-TENNESSEE VALLEY AMBUCS, REGARDING THEIR PROGRAM TO MAKE SPECIAL BICYCLES FOR SPECIAL NEEDS CHILDREN

The Huntsville-Tennessee Valley AMBUCS is an all-volunteer charitable service organization consisting of a diverse group of men and women dedicated to creating mobility and independence for people with disabilities. AMBUCS National has been working of over a decade to give disabled children the chance to pedal with their able-bodied peers.

Ms. Tubell informed the attendees that on August 21st Shaggy's Restaurant in Huntsville will hold a fundraiser starting at 4pm whereby 20% of their proceeds will be donated to Huntsville-Tennessee Valley AMBUCS and on August 23rd Rocket Harley Davidson will also hold a fundraiser. An end-of-summer picnic will be held on August 24th at Joe Davis Stadium which will be open to the public with no cover charge. Lastly, the 2nd annual "Drive the Greens for Charity" fundraising event will be held September 20, 2014 at the Huntsville Municipal Golf Course.

JONATHAN PIERCE: DISCUSS NEW PROJECT ON ZIERDT ROAD

Mr. Pierce was asked by the Mountain Brook of Madison HOA to speak tonight and give voice to their concerns regarding the development of land behind their subdivision. Their concerns involve the removal of mature trees, drainage problems, greenway trail location and development plans for the proposed shopping center. Mr. Pierce urged the Council to enforce the City Code, without alteration, for the new development and ensure that the mature trees be maintained as a barrier to the new development and that Mr. Breland be required to build such screening that will ensure the safety and the beauty of their community.

Council Member Potter corrected Mr. Pierce in regards to the location of the greenway trail. It was not Council that decided the location of the trail but rather ALDOT, through the Metropolitan Planning Organization process.

CHARLES ERWIN: ANNUAL COMPREHENSIVE EXPENDITURE REPORT

Mr. Erwin requested that Dublin Park and Palmer Park be added as expenses so that residents can follow the success or failures of the facilities.

SHARON GILBREATH-HEARD; PENSION ROW PAVING PROJECT

Mrs. Gilbreath-Heard thanked the Public Works Department, Madison City Council and in particular Council Member Potter for the recent paving of Pension Row. She asked where her neighborhood is documented as being located; the Historic District or Mid-Town Development area? Planning Director Amy Bell stated that it is included in the Historic District. Council Member Potter explained that the key development areas inside the City's master plan do not encompass the entire city but rather the key areas they are zeroing in on. The downtown portion that's included in the Capital Improvement Plan does include the Pension Row neighborhood and the Historical District downtown.
