Recreation Membership includes use of the Dublin Indoor Pool during open swim and lap swim, open play basketball/volleyball, upstairs walking track and the Dublin Outdoor Pool (during season).

Dublin Park is a 60 acre Park that includes the Dublin Park Indoor Facility equipped with meeting Rooms, administrative office, a double gymnasium for basketball and/or volleyball, with an upstairs walking track, and a 25 yard heated indoor swimming pool. On the grounds, you will find a 25 yard outdoor swimming pool with a 1 meter and a 3 meter diving board, nine (9) soccer fields, seven (7) lighted tennis courts, a nine (9) hole beginners level disc golf course and the community built Kid's Kingdom Playground.

The hours for the facility are Monday - Friday 5:30am - 9:00pm, Saturday 8:00pm - 8:00pm and Sunday 10:00pm to 6:00pm.

Palmer Park includes two (2) lighted football fields, thirteen (13) baseball fields, six (6) softball fields, six (6) soccer fields, three (3) concession stands, four (4) pavilions, and an ADA playground.



The Madison Senior Center is located at 1282 Hughes Road and is open from 8:00am - 4:00pm each weekday. The Center offers daily fellowship, educational programs and recreational activities for senior adults ages 60 and over. The Center also offers lunch as well as a home-bound meal program. The newly renovated tennis courts are now lined and set for both tennis and pickeball.

**NEIGHBORHOOD PARKS
Greenways and Trails**



The City of Madison has Twenty Eight (28) developed neighborhood parks located throughout the city. Some of the parks include playground equipment, pavilions, stationary grills, open green space, picnic areas, and basketball goals. A complete listing of parks with amenities can be found on the Recreation website.



The Mill Creek Greenway can be accessed via Mill Road between Millstone Subdivision and Mill Creek Elementary School.



The 1.42 acres Mill Creek Dog Park is located on Balch Road and sits along the Mill Creek Greenway. The park is divided into three separate sections, a 20’x30’ staging area at the entrance allows owners to unleash their pet before allowing them to enter the play areas, a section designated for dogs weighing 25 pounds or less, and a designated section for dogs weighing over 25 pounds.



The Bradford Creek Greenway is located along Bradford Creek and can be accessed via Palmer Road, where the trailhead begins.



Rainbow Mountain Preserve is located off of Stoneway Tail. There is a 1.5 mile long loop trail, a .4 mile

Wild Trail and .9 mile JaMooko Trail. “Rocky, with elevation changes.”
